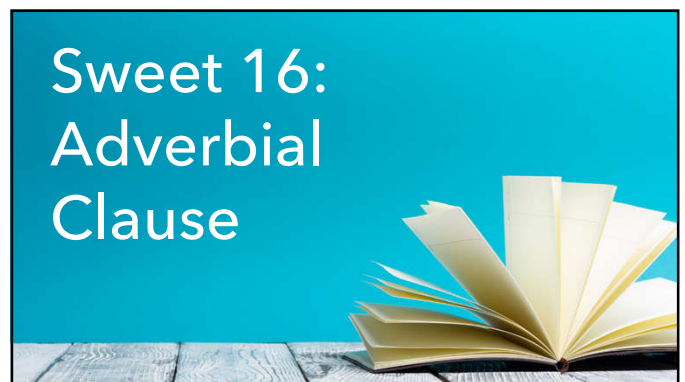

In +/- 200 words explain how the man could have improved his instinct, even while already on the trail. Or, was it too late? Was he fated from the beginning?

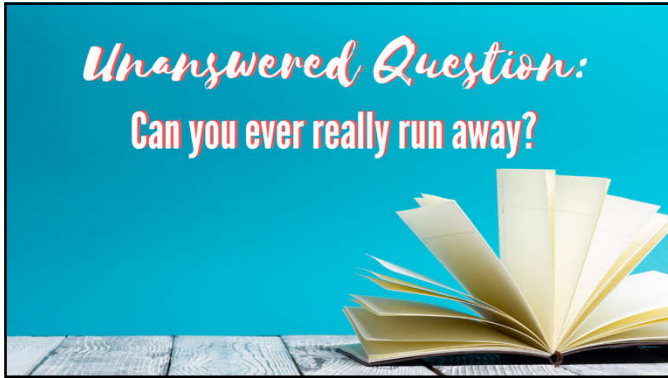

In +/- 200 words, argue that the dog, as part of nature, is part of the man's enemy. Should the dog have helped?

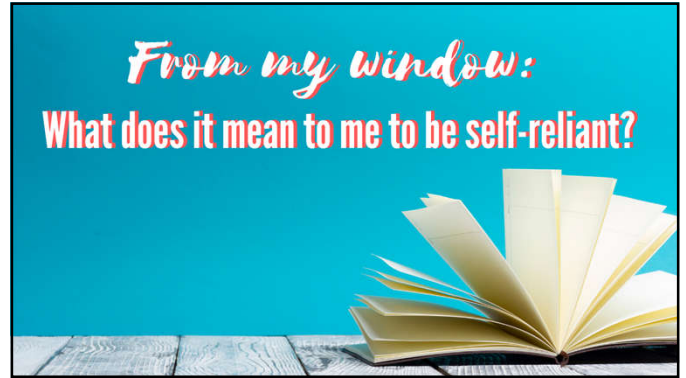
